

**Call for applications**  
**EPC - Carlo Alberto Fellowship**

Applications are invited from individuals holding (or about to obtain) a PhD/doctorate in economics, political science, international relations or a related discipline for a

***Fellowship on EU policies***

for the period **October 2008-July 2009**. The Fellowship is intended to offer young academics (maximum age 35) the opportunity of a post-doctoral experience in the policy world, alternating sojourns in Turin (based at the **Collegio Carlo Alberto**) and Brussels (based at the **European Policy Centre**). The **Compagnia di San Paolo** is co-founder of the Collegio Carlo Alberto - jointly with the University of Turin - and a strategic partner of the EPC.

Priority will be given to candidates proposing projects on the following topics:

- The new 'Energy Policy for Europe' and its internal and external dimensions: implementation, implications, ramifications;
- Europe and its migrants: legal, illegal, and resident – challenges and opportunities;
- Defence industrial markets in the EU: between single market and security policy;
- EU institutions in transition: new Parliament, new Commission, new Council;
- Enlargement and neighbourhood: the Balkan and Mediterranean dimensions;
- The Euro in the global economy: bridging the internal and external dimensions.

The ideal candidate should have:

- Excellent spoken and written English and a working knowledge of Italian;
- Experience of working in an international/multi-cultural environment;
- A solid academic and professional background coupled with a willingness to operate in an action-oriented think tank setting. This includes the ability to translate academic thinking into policy-oriented views;
- Strong organisational skills, including experience in planning and organising seminars and public conferences;
- An interest in acting as a 'liaison officer' between Italy and Brussels, relaying ideas and projects back and forth, feeding and cross-fertilising the respective debates.

In exceptional cases, a relevant professional experience (e.g. with an international organisation) may be considered as a substitute for a formal doctorate.

Remuneration for the Fellowship will depend on individual circumstances. Travel expenses will be reimbursed on an ad hoc basis.

Applications should be sent in English by e-mail only to [m.bedrossian@epc.eu](mailto:m.bedrossian@epc.eu). They should include a detailed CV (including publications), photo and an accompanying letter of motivation, including a description of the proposed project to be carried out.
