WORLD PLOGGING CHAMPIONSHIP 2023: RUNNERS FROM ALL OVER THE WORLD COLLECTED ALMOST 3.000 KG OF WASTE IN GENOA

RUN AND ENVIRONMENTAL AWARENESS: SATURDAY, 30TH SEPTEMBER WAS HELD THE THIRD EDITION OF THE WORLD PLOGGING CHAMPIONSHIP. SPAIN GOT THE TOP STEP OF THE MEN'S PODIUM WITH MANUEL JESÚS ORTEGA GARCÍA. THE WOMAN CHAMPION OF THE FIRST EDITION, ELENA CANUTO, WON THE TITLE BACK. THE EVENT ENDED ON SUNDAY 1ST OCTOBER WITH THE URBAN PLOGGING ACROSS THE HISTORIC STREETS OF GENOA.

Genoa, Sunday 1st october – With the awarding ceremony of the world plogging champions, the third edition of WPC ended in **Genoa**, Italy. Over **80 athletes** from **16 countries** took the challenge, running and collecting the waste they found on the way, surrounded by mountains and the sea.

During the opening ceremony, a special parade started the event with flag bearers from Italy, Algeria, Argentina, Ghana, Japan, Greece, Mexico, The Netherlands, Portugal, United Kingdom, Senegal, Serbia, Spain, Sweden, and Uruguay. Running through the paths of the Ligurian main city, the participants made an impressive success, bonding together joy and environmental awareness.

The social and ecological value of the World Plogging Championship is well demonstrated by the concrete impact generated. Precisely, around 3.000 kg of abandoned waste were collected, more than 2.000 kg (71% of the total amount) of it has been recycled; the athletes run 1.318 km in 6 hours. Numbers that are even more impressive, as we can tell that on average 2,2 kg of waste per km was collected. 6 million g of CO₂ not emitted in atmosphere thanks to the proper recycling process of the waste – this equals 60.000 km travelled by a car or 50 flights Milan-Rome.





During the awarding ceremony, the final ranking displayed the winners for different categories. As usual, the individual scores are calculated by three parameters: **distance**, **heigh difference**, and the **quality/quantity of collected waste**, transformed into CO₂ equivalent not transmitted in the atmosphere.

«The runners managed to surprise us, once again, working hard from the athletic and the environmental point of view; it is astonishing! The quantity of collected waste is triplicated since the last edition – **Roberto Cavallo**, WPC director, states – We thank the Municipality of Genoa for the extraordinary support and all the territorial partners that consented us to realize the event in a new context, where we had the opportunity to test with success and to spread the plogging movement through the streets of the historic city centre».

The organization of the World Plogging Championship got the strong support of the Senator Claudio Barbaro of the Italian Ministry of the Environment and the Energetic Security. At the awarding ceremony, it was present the director of the institutional communication, **Domenico Repetto**, who highlights how: «Environmental protection and the promotion of sport activities represent an extremely relevant binomial for the pursue of the ecological transition goals and for the affirmation of the circular economy processes. In this sense, the plogging discipline is a real excellence in Italy that we want to promote and sustain».

AWARDING RESULTS

Paolo Austoni, with 37,56 km and 3.944 m of altitude difference, is the winner of the men's athletic ranking, whereas **Lara Maiolo** distinguished herself among the women, with 25,25 km and 1.893 m of altitude difference.

From Andalusia, at the top step of the men's podium, the **World Plogging Champion 2023** is **Manuel Jesús Ortega García** with 368.328 points. Spain got the second place too, thanks to **José Luis Lamela** with 256.707 points, and the third one was won by the Italian **Giovanni Porro** with 250.931 total points.





Among the women, the **World Plogging Champion** of the first edition won the title back – that is the Italian **Elena Canuto**, with 115.409 points. At the second position, another Italian **Maria Grazia Celi**, with 110.657 points, whereas the third returns in Spain to **Vanesa Perea Mediavilla**, who got 98.521 points.

All the runners were awarded with special medals – unique pieces made by the artist and architect **Andrea Sarzi Braga**, created reusing waste from electric and electronic devices. Two special prices to the Serbian **Miloš Stanojević** for having collected the largest quantity of WEEE items, and to the Italian **Tommaso Barbi** for the largest number of batteries.

A special fair play award to the Swedish Ellinor Härlin and the Italian Silvia Ines Canavero, while the paralympic award was assigned to Lino Cianciotto.

The closing ceremony of the Championship, presented by **Michele Corti** and **Roberto Giordano**, was held at the end of the pilot edition of the **urban plogging**, in collaboration with the energy partner AXPO – this competition happened in the historic city centre, and it consented the collection of 258 kg of waste. The stage floor welcomed **Domenico Repetto** from the Ministry of the Environment and the Energetic Security, the president of AMIU Genoa **Giovan Battista Raggi**, the WPC director **Roberto Cavallo**, and the inventor of the term *plogging* **Erik Ahlström**.

The World Plogging Championship is organized by AICA – International Association for the Environmental Protection, E.R.I.C.A. soc. coop., ATS Valle dello Sport, AMIU Genova.
